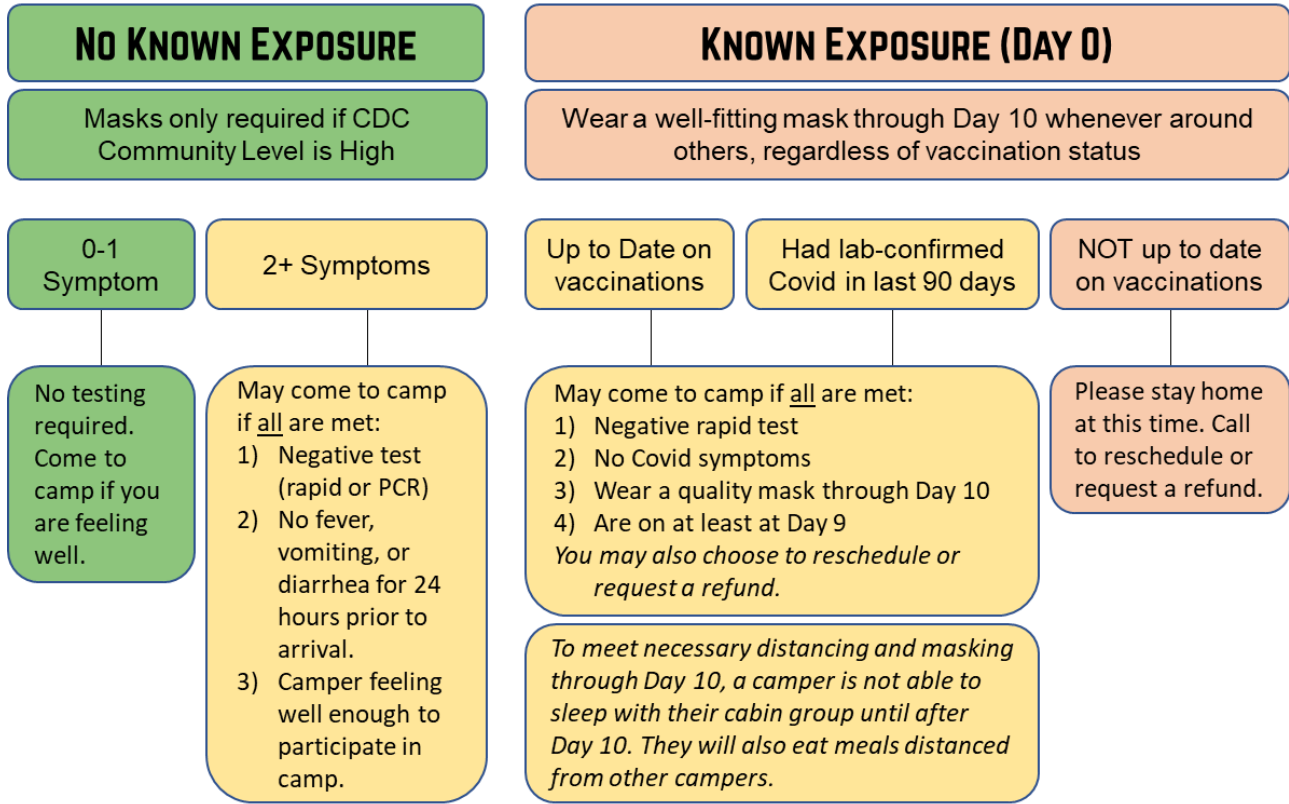


CAMPER GUIDELINES



Exposure: The CDC defines “close contact” as spending a cumulative total of 15 or more minutes within 6 feet of someone with a diagnosed case of Covid-19. Regardless of when symptoms develop, the day of exposure is counted as Day 0.

Up-to-Date: The CDC has determined that you are “up to date” with your Covid-19 vaccines when you have received all doses in the primary series and one booster when eligible. If you have completed your primary series but are not yet eligible for a booster, you are also considered up to date.

STAFF GUIDELINES

NO KNOWN EXPOSURE

Masks only required if CDC Community Level is High

0-1 Symptom

No testing required. Continue to work if you are feeling well.

2+ Symptoms

May continue to work if all are met:

- 1) Negative test (rapid or PCR)
- 2) No fever, vomiting, or diarrhea for 24 hours prior to arrival.
- 3) Staff feeling well enough to do assigned job.

KNOWN EXPOSURE (DAY 0)

Wear a well-fitting mask through Day 10 whenever around others, regardless of vaccination status

Up to Date on vaccinations

Had lab-confirmed Covid in last 90 days

May continue to work if all are met:

- 1) Negative rapid test
- 2) No Covid symptoms
- 3) Wear a quality mask through Day 10

Close-contact staff will complete daily temperature checks and Covid testing.

To meet necessary distancing and masking through Day 10, staff are not able to sleep with their cabin group until after Day 10. They will also eat meals distanced from other staff and campers.

NOT up to date on vaccinations

Please stay home until Day 6. Call your Director to arrange for your absence.
